RESTRICTION This supplemental award provides \$50,000 (\$44,248 direct costs and \$5,752 associated facilities and administrative costs) to replace the support for the publication of IARC Monographs that was lost with the discontinuance of the support contract to TRI, as requested in the awardee's letter dated May 31, 2007. These funds are restricted and may not be expended for any other purpose without the written prior approval of the National Cancer Institute. Funds awarded are available for carryover for awards given carryover authority as reflected in section III of this award notice. However, the funds remain restricted for the purpose for which the supplement is awarded.

INFORMATION This award is issued as a Cooperative Agreement, a financial assistance mechanism which requires cooperation between the awardee and the National Cancer Institute (NCI). The following Terms of Cooperation include the Programmatic Responsibilities of the Grantees, the Nature of Assistance by NCI Staff, Collaborative Responsibilities, and Arbitration Procedures (Attachment 1).

Dear Dr Poland,

The International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) is writing to request supplemental funding for Cooperative Agreement U01-CA33193, Evaluation of Carcinogenic Risks to Humans.

The Collaborative Terms of Award attached to the Notice of Grant Award dated 20 September 2004 states that the National Cancer Institute, through arrangements with a contractor, will provide assistance in preparing *IARC Monograph* sections on chemical and physical data and on production, occurrence, analysis, and use of chemicals. This assistance has been a key source of support for the *Monographs* throughout the 25-year duration of the Cooperative Agreement.

Recently, however, NCI has curtailed this contractor support. This is causing a hardship that could necessitate reducing the scope of these *Monograph* sections. IARC is requesting supplemental funding for the current year and the remaining three years of the current Cooperative Agreement so that IARC can continue to prepare these sections through its own contracting arrangements.

Supplemental funding of \$50,000 per year (direct costs \$44,248, indirect costs \$5,752) (1370) would assist IARC in preparing those sections of highest interest in selected *Monographs*. This amount is less than the value of the contractor support that NCI had provided until last year. To continue to prepare these sections at the same high standard of quality, IARC would apply funds only to those *Monographs* where the value of these sections would be greatest. IARC would not use supplemental funds to cover travel or publication costs.
